Lucy Beth Anthony: "Lighting the candles on the menorah on the first night of Hanukkah and doing all the prayers with my family."


Stanley Dodson: "My favorite part is eating steak at my grandparents' house while looking at the fish outside."






















Senior Spotlights by Kelly Chow

and nice." His favorite memory is when Warner sniffed Coach Flo's smelling salts and almost cried. He plans to major in Agribusiness/Management.




Kelly Chow
